MESSAGE FROM MAYOR MONETZA

With the calendar theme “Beach Life,” Grand Haven highlights the picturesque Lake Michigan beach with its broad expanse of sand, waves, and throngs of visitors who flock here throughout the warm months. Throughout this calendar you will find a celebration in photos of the beach, sunsets, pier and catwalk, boats, and people playing and enjoying one of our most noted assets, the waters and beaches of Lake Michigan. Here, where the Grand River empties into the Lake, our lighthouses stand against time and our boardwalk and pier, our catwalk and lights, are a favorite excursion for residents and visitors alike. Summer festivals, sailing and charter fishing, quaint shops and restaurants await all, as does the simple power of the Lake Michigan shoreline. Bob Warren’s spectacular cover photo of a sunset over the natural beauty of the Lake and our iconic South Pier is a classic vision of our home. Up the river, in Spring Lake and the many bayous, the serene quiet depicted in Geri McCaleb’s October picture of East End Park is an alternative face of Grand Haven’s waterfront. Many thanks to all the photographers who captured and shared these stunning images.

Vacation resorts and summer residences began to flourish here in the late nineteenth century after the early eras of trapping and lumbering waned. Early Grand Haven was sheltered behind the big dunes, notably Dewey Hill, and had the old nickname “Sand Hill City.” Our access to the Lake and the world beyond, and up the Grand River to Grand Rapids and points in the interior of Michigan, positioned us uniquely as a travel destination. The City was an important commercial port, a fishery, a manufacturing hub, and quickly became a destination for a newly affluent middle class escaping the big cities for a brief summer respite. While our old industrial waterfront has given way to

well-kept public parklands, boardwalk, the new Lynne Sherwood Waterfront Stadium, and the City Marina, we preserve echoes of those days in our classic 1870 Grand Trunk Depot, our Pere Marquette locomotive, our coal tipple (the only one in Michigan readily accessible to the public) and our many other historic public artifacts. Those who come to revel in the beach life will find a community rich in history and tradition.

As can be seen in the informational pages of this calendar, the City of Grand Haven provides full service to residents, visitors, business and industry with a full staff of dedicated employees. Public amenities,

facilities, programmed activities, artifacts and public art, are summarized here. Our own Harbor Transit system provides public transit, informational trolleys, busses to the beach and transportation for special event traffic. Our Public Safety, Public Works, and Community Development departments are dedicated to assuring the security and comfort of our neighborhoods. Grand Haven owns and maintains an exceptional range of parks and natural area parklands, roughly one quarter of the land area of the City.

There are many facets to modern Grand Haven. The river is no longer the major trade route, now major highways crisscross the land.

Commerce and industry have evolved into a mix of trades, professional services, and high-tech manufacturing industries providing year-round opportunity for our residents. The Grand River has become a major recreational waterway drawing people to the dunes, rivers and inland lakes, and to a comprehensive system of city and county parks, offsetting the bustle of the beach and offering year-round activity. Not just a beach town, Grand Haven strives to be a complete community, focused on high quality of life for our residents and an outstanding experience for our visitors.

Goals Come From Public Input

Grand Haven City Council works on a goal statement toward the end of each calendar year. The graphic on this page is the goal statement for 2019–2020. Council sets priorities for staff to accomplish and understands that, without stated priorities, an organization tends to drift. With well-defined priorities, the City makes substantial progress on several key fronts.

In the fall of 2019, City Council will set a new series of overarching goals for 2020-2021. The goals generated by City Council provide guidance to the City Manager and enable him to deliver the services and quality of life that the people of Grand Haven expect.

Call your elected officials and let them know what YOU think is important for Grand Haven. All of the goals shown here came from the people of Grand Haven, and next year's goals will come from public input as well.

Government Structure

The Grand Haven City Council serves as the elected body of the City and is comprised of the mayor and four council members, all who live within the City limits. City Council establishes policy by allocating public funds in the form of an annual budget. The City Council appoints a professionally trained and experienced manager to administer the day-to-day operations of the City and provide policy recommendations. Grand Haven is among the more than 175 home rule cities in Michigan that use the council-manager form of government.

City Council Meeting Schedule



Council meetings are held in the Council Chambers of Grand Haven City Hall, located at 519 Washington Avenue on the first and third Monday of every month, at 7:30 p.m., except when otherwise indicated. Work sessions may be held prior to council meetings. Meeting dates are subject to change. Visit our website to view agenda packets and meeting notices. Boards & Commissions

City of Grand Haven boards and commissions are made up of members chosen from the community. City Council and staff rely on boards and commissions to give a citizen's point of view when discussing specific projects or issues. Listening, expressing points of view and considering other points of view is essential.

Key board member duties are:

- Regular attendance at board meetings.
- Active participation in board meetings and functions.
- Listening to other points of view.
- Expressing points of view.
- Contribute to board decisions.
- Accept leadership responsibilities.

According to the Charter, several City boards only allow members to serve on one board at a time.

If a board member serves two full terms, they must leave the board for at least one year before they can be reappointed.

Many terms end in June; however, openings can occur at any time due to other factors. Please check the City's web site for the most current list of vacancies.

Assessing & Property Taxes

Assessing Division

The City's Assessing Division is managed by Ottawa County Equalization employees through a contract between the City of Grand Haven and Ottawa County. Joshua Morgan is our primary contact and is available by appointment at City Hall. Please call 616-846-8262 for assistance on assessing and property appraisal matters or to set up an appointment.



Property Assessment

You will receive a "Change in Assessment Notice" in mid-February. If you believe the assessment of your property is incorrect, you may appeal to the Board of Review. The board meets March 16-18 at City Hall; please schedule an appointment or appeal by mail. Contact the City Assessor's Office at 616-846-8262.

Tax Payment Postmark Policy

The City of Grand Haven will accept postmarks from the United States Postal Service as proof of timely payment. Any payments made through bill pay, online banking, metered mail, as well as UPS and Federal Express will be posted the day they are received in the Treasury Department.



Neighborhood Housing Services

Neighborhood Housing Services (NHS) is a United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved housing counseling agency providing services to Ottawa and Muskegon County residents. The agency offers financial education services in group and one-on-one settings. NHS also helps residents access grants and loans for home repairs.



NHS offers home buyer education, renter education and mortgage default counseling. The complete class schedule is available at: www.grandhaven.org/housingservices.

NHS also offers free one-on-one financial counseling to help you reach your financial goals: improve your credit, reduce debt, develop a budget, become mortgage-ready, or learn about student loan repayment options. If you are facing foreclosure or experiencing a situation that threatens your housing stability, NHS can provide you with free, confidential, and unbiased information about your options and your rights.

NHS also helps administer the City's On Bill Financing Water/Sewer Replacement Program. Income-eligible City of Grand Haven residents can finance the installation or replacement of water/sewer laterals through NHS and make the payments on their utility bill. Household income must be below 100% of area median income. Other restrictions apply. Please contact NHS for more information about any of our classes or programs: 616-935-3270.

Rental Registration

If you own residential rental property in the City of Grand Haven, it must be registered with the Community Development Department. The rental program is designed to help protect the safety of the tenants, as well as the owners, and improves and maintains the quality of our neighborhoods. Landlord cooperation is critical to the success of this program. Rental property registration is required in accordance with the City of Grand Haven Code of Ordinances Section 9-201. Payment per rental unit along with the rental registration forms are due in February of each year. There is a per property late fee if the form and fees are not received by the due date. Inspections are conducted every three years, and a Certificate of Compliance is issued based upon compliance with the requirements of the property maintenance code.



Grand Haven Food Pantries


Our generous community has many options for families to access needed nutrition at area food pantries. Most are coordinated through the Salvation Army or Love in Action.

Sidewalks, Snow and Safe Routes to School

Please remove snow accumulations from your sidewalks this and every winter. We are working to improve the walkability of our town, and all residents can help by shoveling off the sidewalks. The Safe Routes to School program is designed to increase the number of kids who walk or bike to school; sidewalks free from snow and ice will help.



Many residents in our school neighborhoods have indicated that they may not be able to clear snow from their sidewalks following every storm. Rather than issue warnings, invoices, and tickets, the City is appealing to all neighborhoods—please help clear a path, especially in school neighborhoods.

Leave the car in the driveway and take a walk this winter; but, first, grab a snow blower or shovel and join your neighbors in keeping our sidewalks clear and safe for everyone.

Residential Trash, Recycling & Yard Waste Service

Republic Services, Inc. provides weekly residential trash, recycling, and yard waste removal within the City of Grand Haven. Bags are available for sale at the Treasurer's Office of City Hall for "bag service" customers. Please call Republic Services at 877-698-7274 to set up your service. Visit www.republicservices.com for frequently asked questions and more!



Customers who travel away from home may call Republic Services prior to leaving to have their account placed on "vacation hold." You will not receive an invoice for the time you indicate to them you will be away.

Large or Extra Items—Bulky items may be placed at the curb for pick-up with your regular trash each week. Major appliances and furniture will be picked up on the last Friday of each month. Please call Republic Services in advance to schedule a pick-up.

Yard Waste Service—Republic Services provides curbside yard waste collection services April 1 to December 31. Paper yard waste bags or a container marked "yard waste" may be used. Yard waste drop-off sites are also scheduled at Lakeshore Middle and Griffin Elementary Schools from 8:00 a.m. until noon on eight consecutive Saturdays in both the spring and the fall. Please Do Not Deposit Leaves or Other Debris in Street

Section 17-3 of the City Code prohibits the accumulation, deposit or disposal of leaves, yard waste or other materials in the public right-of-way, including the street right-of-way, alleys and sidewalks. Leaves, yard waste or other prohibited materials left in the public right-of-way may be collected and removed by the City with the cost of such collection billed to the adjacent property owner, plus a fine. The City will charge for actual time and material needed to remove prohibited deposits.

Household Hazardous Waste

Metal Recycling

First Christian Reformed Church (located at 516 S. Ferry) operates a Metal Recycle Ministry. The church collects all types of metal (except televisions and computer monitors). Disposing of Unused Medicine

Scientists have found medicines in surface, ground and marine waters, as well as soils and sediments. Even very low levels of medicines enter the environment and affect human health. Registering to Vote

You may register at your local Secretary of State branch office or Clerk's Office. If you're not sure where to vote or if you have any additional questions, contact the City Clerk's Office at 616-847-4886.

Voting

To vote, simply appear at your assigned polling place with your photo ID on election day. The polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Elections in 2020 will be held on May 5, August 4, and November 3.

Absent Voter's Ballot

Upon application to the clerk, you may qualify for an absent voter's ballot. Please remember to allow enough time for you to receive the ballot and to return it to the City Clerk's Office by 8:00 p.m. on election day.

Election Inspectors

The Clerk's Office is always looking for additional election inspectors. Contact the City Clerk's Office at 616-847-4886 if you are interested in working during an election.

Political Sign Information

Temporary political signs must be located on private property, comply with corner clearance requirements, not exceed 12 square feet in display area per side of sign, and be removed no later than seven days after the election. The signs must include the committee's name, address, and telephone number.

Harbor Transit Beach Express Service

The Harbor Transit Beach Express will pick up beach-goers in the parking lot located at 803 Taylor Street (across from Automatic Spring Products). The cost is \$1 per person for the round-trip service. The Beach Express operates as needed during high volume beach days; on-site signs will announce when in operation.



Fireworks Traffic

Parking

Overnight Parking Permit for Downtown Municipal Lots

A self-service parking Kiosk is located in our downtown, at the NW corner of First Street and Franklin Avenue. For just \$5 you may purchase an overnight parking permit for downtown municipal parking lots. This is a great option for late night visitors/guests to downtown. Violations can be costly, so protect your wallet with an overnight parking kiosk permit and remember to be responsible; never drink and drive.



Winter Parking on Streets

Parking on public streets within the City is restricted between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from December 1 until April 1 for street maintenance, except as otherwise permitted.



Dog Regulations

Responsible Dog Ownership

Many who reside in and visit the City of Grand Haven know the pleasures of having a dog and understand that responsibility comes with good dog ownership. Dog owners are expected to keep their pets on a leash and under control anywhere in the City except private property. Owners are required to pick up waste left by their dog. The City encourages active enjoyment and responsible behavior by providing Mutt-Mitt dispensers in numerous public areas. Rules regarding barking dogs, leashes and cleaning up after pets are enforced by the Department of Public Safety (Code of Ordinances, Chapter 7).



Dogs are allowed in all City parks, but they must be on a leash and owners must adhere to City ordinances and rules regarding dogs and pets. Dogs are restricted from the Farmers Market while open (Wednesdays & Saturdays). Dogs are not allowed on the City Beach at any time between 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Off-Leash Areas

There are two locations within the City to allow your dog off-leash. A fenced dog park is located at the East Grand River Park and a second area is a posted off-leash trail in the parklands at the south end of Mulligan's Hollow, which is accessible off Lake Avenue.

Dog Licenses

Licenses need to be renewed in the month in which the dog's rabies vaccination expires and will be available year-round. Dog licenses can be purchased from the City Treasurer's Office, the County Treasurer's Office, the Harbor Humane Society, and some veterinarians if they have opted into the program.

CITY FACILITIES & SERVICES

City Manager's Office

The City Manager's Office is responsible for facilitating the goals of City Council. The mayor and council formulate broad policy initiatives and direct the manager in the execution of their will. The City Manager's Office is charged with responding to the needs of the entire community and is ultimately responsible for the daily operations of the municipal organization.

City Clerk's Office

The City Clerk serves as Clerk to the City Council. The Clerk's Office provides informational services to residents, the general public, and other City departments. Additionally, this office is responsible for the management and preservation of the City's official documents, maintaining voter registration records and administering elections held in the City, maintaining and providing electronic access to the City Charter and Code of Ordinances, coordinating Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests, and posting public notices.

Community Development

The Community Development Department is responsible for administering the City's planning, zoning, housing, construction regulation, code enforcement programs, and community affairs.

The department helps current and future property owners understand how they can develop their property and what may happen in the future within their neighborhood. Permits for smaller projects like driveways, sheds, and commercial signs are also issued by the Community Development Department.

Finance Department

The Finance Department ensures that budgetary and financial requirements are met, auditing and accounting standards are followed, the City's annual audit is properly reported, payment of invoices and billing of services are made timely, and grants and loans to the City are appropriately reported. The department provides financial services for all City Funds (and, by contract, the Sewer Authority, the Nows Plant, Northwest Ottawa Recreation Authority and Ottawa County Central Dispatch Authority).


Public Safety Department

The Grand Haven Department of Public Safety is a multi-disciplinary agency that carries out law enforcement, firefighting operations, and medical first responder services within the City of Grand Haven. Routine daily activities include but are not limited to: enforcement of state and local laws, criminal investigations, intelligence gathering, search and rescue, fire suppression, and hazardous materials response.

Public Works Department

Under the direction of the DPW Director, the department is comprised of the following service areas: cemetery, custodial, facilities and grounds, maintenance, marina/waterfront, motor pool, parks and grounds, project management, streets and storm water, utilities (water distribution and sanitary sewer collection systems), and water filtration.

Harbor Transit


Harbor Transit services a 55-square-mile area. The system serves the City of Grand Haven, the Village of Spring Lake, the City of Ferrysburg, Grand Haven Charter and Spring Lake Townships. Harbor Transit is administered by the Harbor Transit Multi-Modal Transportation System. Policy direction is provided by an eleven-member board of directors, which is composed of two representatives of the five participating units of governments and a member at large. Services provided by Harbor Transit include demand-response public bus transit, contractual services, and trolley transportation. Main Street

Grand Haven is one of only 29 communities in the state to operate a nationally accredited Main Street program through Michigan Main Street. Formed in 2005, the mission of Main Street is to enhance a vibrant historic business district through community efforts, plus public and private partnerships. To achieve this mission, we actively engage volunteers to complete projects and host special events in the Downtown/Centerdown district. Water Treatment Plant



The Northwest Ottawa Water Treatment Plant is operated and managed by the City of Grand Haven, under contract since 1988, for the Townships of Grand Haven and Spring Lake, the City of Ferrysburg and the Village of Spring Lake, which make up the Northwest Ottawa Water System (NOWS). The water treatment plant is approved to filter and pump 23.25 million gallons per day. The facility produces potable drinking water, averaging about 2 billion gallons annually, which meets or exceeds all state and EPA requirements to provide industrial, commercial and domestic water needs including fire protection. The laboratory and staff are state certified for total coliform, e-coli and heterotrophic plate count

analyses. Treatment plant staff members are qualified to provide limited physical parameter testing for potable drinking water including testing for turbidity, chlorine, fluoride, hardness, alkalinity, calcium and pH.

Sewer Authority

The Grand Haven Spring Lake Sewer Authority Wastewater Treatment Plant entered into municipal service in 1973. It serves the City of Grand Haven, Grand Haven Township, the Village of Spring Lake, Spring Lake Township, and the City of Ferrysburg. The plant is designed for a 6.67 MGD (million gallons/day) flow, with a current average flow of 3 MGD. The plant is staffed by a plant superintendent, an environmental compliance supervisor, an operations supervisor, and six operator-mechanics. The plant added a Biological Odor Control System and converted the disinfection process from chlorine gas to ultraviolet light in 2013.
